

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Sail Training Report By Bill Records

The Sail Training Program at AYC is off and running with a lot of enthusiasm from those involved. We finally hired a coach for the Roadrunners. Her name is **Kate Noble** and she comes to us from Massachusetts. She ran a successful sailing program at a youth camp in Vermont and brings valuable organizational skills to our program. The regularly scheduled practices will start after the TSA Roadrunner Regatta, of which the details will be announced soon.

The first event of the 2011 season was a hastily organized junior clinic on February 20th. We felt that it was important for the kids to have a practice before the regatta because most of the kids haven't sailed their boats since November. Alan Rochard ran the clinic with Kate Noble assisting, and it was a big success. About thirty kids showed up, in spite of the cold water and winds gusting to 29MPH! Each one received excellent on the water coaching with a wrap up talk afterward. We plan on having our own "coach boat" on the water for the regatta.

With the increase in junior participation, the issue of more accessible boat storage is being considered. Having an area for the juniors to store boats and dollies near the south ramp would be of great help. We are in the process of dealing with this issue.

"Combined Start" Barbecue Sauce

Voted "People's Choice" Best BBQ Sauce in Texas at the BBQ sauce cook-off at the end of the Frostbite Series banquet on February 19, 2011. Works well with beef, pork, chicken, ribs, J/22s and J/24s. Use caution with casseroles, desserts, South Coast 21s, Ensigns and Catalina 22s. Yields 128 servings.

Prep Time: 20 Min Cook Time: 1 Hr Ready In: 1 Hr 20 Min

Ingredients:

- •2 (15 ounce) cans apricot halves, drained
- •3 cups packed brown sugar
- 4 cups cider vinegar
- •1 (29 ounce) can tomato sauce
- •2 cups ketchup
- •1 cup maple syrup
- •1 cup prepared mustard
- •1/2 cup orange juice
- •1/2 cup honey
- •3 tablespoons salt
- •1/2 cup molasses
- •3 tablespoons chicken bouillon granules
- •2 tablespoons crushed red pepper flakes
- 4 tablespoons garlic powder
- •4 tablespoons onion powder
- •2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 tablespoon pepper
- Juice of one lemon

Directions:

In a blender or food processor, puree the apricots until smooth. Pour into a large soup pot kettle or Dutch oven; add the next 17 ingredients. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; pot, simmer, uncovered, for 1 hour or until flavors are blended, stirring occasionally. Stir in liquid smoke if desired. Cool. Store in the refrigerator.

Dock replacement update

Late last year the Travis County Fire Marshal's office adopted the Marina Fire Protection Ordinance, which reguires all new marinas and modifications to existing marinas to provide a fire suppression system consisting of an approved water supply and stand pipe with a fire department connection (FDC). An approved water supply can be from either a public water supply, i.e. a fire hydrant, or can be pumped from the lake. The ordinance requires that every part of each dock is no further than 150' from an FDC, with this distance being measured as the path of travel along the dock walkway. Since there are no fire hydrants on the AYC grounds, this means we are required to install a pump and standpipe on each and every dock as they are replaced. Because our docks are all more than 150' in length we will also have to provide an additional standpipe w/FDC that is accessible from a fire boat to meet the distance requirement. We are working with ESD #6 and the Travis County Fire Marshal to figure out how we will do this.

We expect to have the LCRA permit for dock replacement issued by the end of February. We already know that the LCRA permit will be conditioned on compliance with all Federal, State and Local rules, regulations and ordinances; therefore, we will be required to provide some means of complying with the Marina Fire Protection ordinance prior to gaining acceptance of the dock replacement. A special condition of the LCRA permit prohibits us from occupying the docks until we have received a successful final inspection and written authorization to occupy and operate the new facilities. Therefore, the LCRA can prevent us from occupying the docks until we have complied with the Marina Fire Protection ordinance.

We currently have a total of 60 wet slips between docks 1 & 3 (33 on dock 1 and 27 on dock 3). When the new docks arrive we will be losing two slips, one from each dock, giving us a total of 58 between those two docks. This is a result of our plan to provide connecting walkways between the docks, which will allow us to build one new access point to docks 1, 2, and 3 instead of a new access for each dock. A similar plan is being made for docks 4, 5, & 6. The regulations pertaining to dock access have been in place a long time, and with the current replacement plan our days of delaying action on the matter are over: the LCRA is taking the opportunity to force the installation of acceptable gangways. We are working on dock configuration alternatives that will accommodate our wet slip needs while addressing the regulatory requirements in a cost effective way. Input on this topic is welcome. More Changes on the Way

All who join us on Opening Day, and everyone visiting AYC on a regular basis, will see some marked facilities improvement as a result of the AYC-wide capital improvement programs approved for 2011. The pool has been completely refurbished, with new quartz plaster, new tile and markings, new and compliant pump, circulation and filtering system. All will be operational by pool opening time in May!

You'll also notice repairs, upgrades and new paint for the club house and office. By early March, repainting and major repairs to all rental cabins will be complete, as well as replacement of all mattresses and futons.

And that's not it! Work on replacing docks #1 and #3 will begin in March. Initial construction of LCRA compliant access to docks #1-#3 will commence during March and April. Rigging docks will be repaired and updated as well. So be with us on March 13 to celebrate our many years of growth and progress and help us launch our next phase and growth at AYC!

Dock 6 damaged in winter blast

The arctic blast that swept across Texas on February 1st brought high winds and plenty of cold temperatures. The 50+ knot winds whipping in from the north and coming down Pool Canyon put our anchoring system to the test. The good news is the anchors all appear to have held their ground. The bad news is that Dock 6 was the critical link between the main lateral line set up in Pool Canyon and the other five docks to leeward. As the docks all shifted south in the strong north winds, the forces became too great at the lateral line connection point and Dock 6 buckled, causing enough damage to have to replace an entire segment of the dock with a new structure. We have engaged Lakeside Marine Services to make this repair. Hopefully, by the time this article is published the repairs will have been completed.

Dock move plans

We've been fortunate so far this year with the lake level holding relatively steady. We began the year about 2' below the average January elevation of 669' msl, and

Race Commander Report

As I write this month's Race Commander's report, we are more than half way through the **Frostbite Series**. Participation for this series has been higher than I can remember for many years. We have had 56 boats entered and most of those have been out on the water either as participants or race committee each week.

Regatta Network: This year we are using the Regatta Network for registration and scoring. There are links on the AYC home page to directly connect competitors to registration form. For those of you who are U S Sailing members, you need merely to enter your U S Sailing number and it will fill out most of the form for you. In the past, we have had complaints that boat names, skipper names, numbers, PHRF ratings, etc. were entered incorrectly. This should take care of that problem. You only need to register once per series, then drop by the RC room before each race to check off the box next to your sail number.

<u>Fewer Starts:</u> During the Frostbite Series, we have also experimented with reducing the number of starts. This was in response to a decrease in participation by several fleets. By combining starts, we have decrease the total number from 9 to 5, decreasing the burden on race committees. I have not seen any significant problems arising from the new system and it definitely has made the SC 21-Ensign-Catalina 22 start more interesting.

<u>Upcoming Races:</u> The last weekend of February AYC is hosting the J/80 Circuit Stop. It looks as though we are having a good level of participation this year. This is always an exciting and fun event with a high level of competition. **Opening Day Regatta** is scheduled for March 13th. This will be a long distance race which will follow the brunch and assorted fanfare. Don't forget to pick up some of those hot t-shirts. For those of you who aren't sailing, you can still order shirts through our online store. Just click on the t-shirt link in the Opening Day Regatta link on our web site.

Education: This year we are putting a major emphasis on education. We have already had the Race Management Seminar which was held January 15th, given by Brad Davis. There was a great turnout with a total of 45 students. An on-the-water Motor Boat Handling Seminar, was held in two sessions on January 16th. Twenty six students including 6 UT students were trained in high and low speed maneuvers, rescue, an-

choring and mark setting. It has been several decades since we have had such a course and the trainees were encouraged to pass this information along to fellow club members. The course was organized by **Vic Manning** and given by **Steve Gay**. Many thanks to **Remus Broussard**, **Jorge Trevino** and **Dane Ohe** for their help. Upcoming clinics include a Rules Roundtable Discussion which will be given by **Brad Davis** on February 12th and a Rules and Protest Management Seminar to be given sometime in March. We hope to make the Rules Roundtable Discussion a regular feature with different topics each month.

The AYC Race Management Handbook has been extensively updated to reflect changes in the rules and club race management. Copies of this document can be viewed and downloaded from the club web site.

We have a new protest form for use at club events. The old form was outdated. The new form is in compliance with U S Sailing and Racing Rules of Sailing.

Your race commander has been working with **Scott Spurlin** to bring J World to the Austin Yacht Club. It will be held the week immediately prior to our Opening Day Regatta. The on-the-water clinic will be held in J/80s and will give AYC members the chance to participate in a high energy advanced yacht racing experience without the expense and inconvenience of travelling to Annapolis. The course will be directly billed through J World to participants, so there will be no expense to the club. There will be two separate courses, one for intermediate racers and the other for advanced racers.

We are off to a great start to what looks like a great year of racing at the club. See you on the water.

1/4	C.	brown suga


1/4 c. honey

Buildings & Grounds Report

Many of you may have noticed the work crews at our club. Your Building and Grounds Committee (John Saunders, Steve Brown and Garett Kates) has been pretty busy. The clubhouse, the office and buildings 4,5,6, 7 and 8 are all being repainted. In preparation for the paint, rotted wood in the ramp railings, balcony, office dormer, buildings 4 and six, are also being replaced. New doors are being installed in the office and two of the rental cabins.

All the rental cabins have received new mattresses and futons. Protective covers for the mattresses, pillows and futons have also been installed. Worn and frayed bedspreads have been replaced and the futon outer covers are being laundered. We are replacing the windows in cabin 6 in accordance with current code and energy standards....they will actually close...no more duct tape.

I am sure all of you have noticed the pool re-plastering. We have chosen a quartz based plaster for the pool. It is much more durable and carries a lifetime warranty. We have also hired a pool service to assist our caretaker, **Tom Cunningham**, in maintaining the pool in accordance with the warranty requirements. The pool filter has been upgraded to a DE commercial size filter and valves/plumbing have been replaced to take full advantage of the new filtering capacity. The main drain has been split to follow code requirements and tiles marking depth and "No Diving" have been installed. The pool is now in full compliance with health and safety codes.

All metal railing/fencing, metal staircase and clubhouse cap-railing are being prepped for painting with a tougher semi gloss paint to provide better service life and quality of use.

A plumbing contractor has been retained to evaluate our septic system and that work is currently in progress.

Men.... notice the mirror in the clubhouse restroom. A plumbing upgrade for the men's bathhouse is being installed to correct a persistent plumbing problem and this should generate an immediate cost savings.

The galley (many thanks to the Social Committee chair, **Susie McDonald**) utensils have been sorted and upgraded to provide better utility and service. We are looking at a bid to move the beer dispenser and soda cooler out of the galley. Action on that should be completed soon.

John Saunders and Steve Brown are replacing the

Work Area hoist chain and one of the halyards on the club mast due to excessive wear. The lines in the mast hoists are also scheduled for replacement.

We need your help. I am planning a Work Day for Saturday, 26 February. Please mark your calendars. A detailed email will be sent out. You will need to bring a leaf rake, gloves and brooms. Volunteers will be divided into teams dedicated to raking, sweeping, table washing, brush pile chipping and possibly power washing. The thrust of this effort will be "spring cleaning" for opening day. I plan to have several more work parties as the year progresses and various projects come to fruition. A blast email will be sent out with information about the upcoming workday. I will request an RSVP to the workday. I need to know the size of our work force in order to schedule our work. Please make yourself available.

with a little help in the form of precipitation and cool weather combined with the LCRA's lowering of Inks Lake and Lake Austin, we've been able to avoid moving Docks 4, 5 and 6 out to their low water position. But the near term forecast suggests that our luck may be running out. With lake levels dropping at approximately 0.1' per day we should expect to be moving Docks 4, 5 & 6 before the end of March. With all the racing activities scheduled during the month of March (Road Runner regatta, Opening Day regatta, J24 Circuit regatta, Spring Series Race 1) it will require a lot of coordination and compromise to get the docks moved and still have RC boats available for the various events. Be on the lookout for work party notices as that time draws nearer.

<u>Slip assignments and waiting lists:</u> As of the date of this writing:

- •There are thirteen empty dry slips, with no requests for moves or assignment.
- •There are seven empty board boat slips, with no requests for moves or assignment.
- •All of the wet slips are currently occupied, with the exception of some of the inside slips. Due to the dropping lake level and our efforts to reconfigure our dock arrangements the inside slips that are currently vacant will remain that way. The inside slips that are currently occupied will be re-assigned to another slip as the inside slips are removed from our docking arrangement. There are six wet slip movement requests oddly enough everybody wants a leeward slip.
- •There are three wet slip assignment requests; however, none of the requestors currently own a boat to put in a wet slip so none of those requests have been granted.

Boat registrations: AYC House Rule #6 requires that "All members shall obey County, State, and Federal laws that apply to the operation of the Club." The Texas Administrative Code, Title 31, Part 2, Chapter 53, Subchapter E, Rule 53.90 follows:

- (a) Documented vessels are required to display the registration validation sticker on both sides of the bow and maintain current documentation through the United States Coast Guard or display the state-assigned TX numbering series with the decal. Commercial vessels used in coastal shipping and vessels exceeding 115 feet in length are exempt from registration requirements.
- (b) Vessels registered as antique boats are permitted to display the registration validation sticker on the left portion of the windshield. In the absence of a windshield, the registration validation sticker must be

2010 Miami Orange Bowl International Youth Regatta Report

Miami Orange Bowl International Youth Regatta on December 26-29, 2010: AYC's Alan Rochard (Laser Radial, sail # 29/170806), Alexandra Mares (Opti Blue Fleet, sail # 14911), and Spencer LeGrande (Opti Blue Fleet, sail # 15120) experienced the largest international youth regatta in the United States over Christmas break. A group of about 30 sailors from Texas converged on Miami's Coral Reef Yacht Club, joining a crowd of 665 of the best sailors in the world (ages 8 to 18) in 562 boats racing in 6 classes representing 21 countries and 23 states. There were 218 Optis in the Red/White/Blue Fleet and 50 Optis in the Green Fleet. The rest were Lasers and 420's.

This was Spencer's home club before joining AYC and he was glad to be on familiar territory! Not knowing what

to expect, travel time for Alexandra was 16 hours by car, split into two days with an overnight stay, for her first race being coached by USNT Head Coach, **Scott Norman**. Allen had raced in this regatta many times before

and **The Rochards** were happy to see their friends from France. Many of the Opti sailors from Texas texted each other along the way, making the voyage seem like a huge caravan.

On the first day of the regatta, there was ice on the boats and on the sails, with temperatures unseasonably cold at 32 degrees and wind gusting to 34 knots. This was not Miami weather! By the second day, all the Opti sailors' parents who didn't own dry suits for their kids, bellied up to the various vendors booths and bought one. The initial shock of the weather was second, however, to the shock of how the boats were being launched. They were dropped 12 feet from the ground into the water, stern first, while other boats sailed by! Oh, and the sailor had to climb down the side of the dock, to get into their boat! Luckily, none of the Texas boats were reported damaged from the launching. By the second day, the temperature was a little warmer and the breeze a little calmer and the temperature continued to rise while the wind continued to diminish as the regatta went on, culminating in full blown glass and canceled races. Out of 111 sailors in Blue Fleet, Alexandra Mares scored 98 and Spencer LeGrande scored 88. Alan Rochard scored an impressive 59 out of 139. Way to go Roadrunners! When you see these sailors, please congratulate them. They prove that sailing is, indeed, a year-round sport.


