As I am composing this article the Pedernales River is at flood stage and the level of Lake Travis is rising through 650 feet. While this is certainly good news to those of us that use the lake for recreation it is somewhat disruptive to some of the club's plans. Last week we submitted a plan to the LCRA for excavating the harbor to increase its depth. This will allow us to keep our slips in their normal locations much more of the time. For details of the plan see last month's "From the Commodore". The plan was to get approval and bids for the project and then proceed with the excavation. With the lake waters now rising we may have missed this opportunity. This points to the need to be ready for this kind of work so we can act when conditions permit. As a result, we will continue to prepare for the excavation even though the actual work may need to be put off.

meeting December 7, please consider this slate of candidates and return your proxy. It is important that we receive these so we can have enough votes, 25% of the membership, to meet the needs for a quorum.

Please set aside this evening and plan to attend what promises to be a fun party.

Non-Resident Member Discount:

Members whose primary residence is more than 200 miles from AYC and who have no boats on AYC property may request in writing a 50% discount in monthly dues.

Ol' Salt Member Discount:

Members who are 62 years of age or older, who have been AYC members for ten years or more, and who have no boats stored on AYC property may request in writing a 50% Ol' Salt discount in monthly dues. Members qualifying for an Ol' Salt Membership Discount who have been members longer than 25 years may request a 100% discount in monthly dues. Board approval is required.

AYC Junior Championships




