New Business Hours

The Board and the Office Staff have been talking about how to improve being available to take care of business items for members and guests that prefer to handle such in person. Items like questions about or paying their AYC bill, filling out and submitting

a Facilities Usage Request form or say registering for an upcoming regatta. Believe me, we all understand that the members who wish to do club business in person have been frustrated at times when they have tried to randomly come into the office and can't find the appropriate staff person to help them.

What we have come up with is to create what I call 'lobby' hours for the AYC Office. Like a bank, these lobby hours are the times the primary focus of the Office Staff will be to handle your business items (on the phone or in person). Said another way, these will be the core hours for you to interact with the Office Staff to work on whatever AYC business you may want to take care of in person. And if you prefer to call the office to get something handled, the goal will be for the Office Staff to answer your call in person (not roll over to voicemail) when you call during the lobby hours. If you call during non-lobby hours and leave a voicemail (which will be the case most likely if you call during non-lobby hours), the staff will be returning you call during the next lobby hour period after you called.

Keep in mind the Office Staff will rotate being on point during the lobby hours so you may not be able to close on all you business items at the time. Say you have a question about billing and our Events Coordinator/Sailing Director is working during the lobby hours you come in/call, well depending on the particulars, she may need to take your information and have our Office Administrator get back with you later. But you will be able to talk with someone and make sure all the details are understood. Like wise if you have an events related question and the Office Administrator is on duty, you may not be able to close on your request. But for the vast majority of common items you will be able to get what you need done. And over time your requests will help the Office Staff understand what are the common request and get training to be able to handle them to your satisfaction at the time you make the request or have the question.



C-22 Fleet News By John Grzinich





Let's Keep It Rolling...Starting with a Fleet Social!



Harbor Commander News By Bob Gal-



NOTICE: To those storing boats or trailers on the point: The Leukemia cup Regatta is coming soon, and we expect a large influx of participants & visitors. We want to have a clear point for traffic and trailer parking. Please move your boats and/or trail-

ers to one of three places: (1) Empty trailers of boats in slips may be stored in the trailer parking area immediately below the dry sail area (DSA) area; (2) A DSA slot already assigned for your use; or (3) The open area usually used during floods. This is the open field you see on your left as you enter AYC's gate. This area is most accessible from the gravel roadway next to the dry out area, or from AYC's main entrance drive.

THIS IS NOT A DRILL! As a reminder, AYC harbor rules state that you must have your name and AYC marked on both sides of your trailer tongues. This includes dollies! Per last month's Telltale, the Harbor Committee put you on notice that there would be a painting of trailer tongues in the Dry Sail Area to bring trailers there into agreement with harbor rules. Arrangements are in process as we speak to have our youth sailing organization do this work. If you are not interested in making an assessed donation to the youth sailing group, get your trailer names on fast. Time is running out!

One more point on this; keep in mind that also just like a bank, the Office Staff will still be working during nonlobby hours, they just won't be available to the general membership in an unscheduled manner. The objective is to give the Office Staff the quiet time they need to work on their tasks that take an extended period of uninterrupted time. This means that the office door will be locked and a "Closed" sign will be posted on the door. You may see through the windows the Office Staff running around the office still then but they won't be available. Please honor this arrangement. Of course you can always make arrangements ahead of time to schedule a mutually agreeable time to handle your club business in person or on the phone outside the lobby hours, but you have to plan it!

OK, so what are these lobby hours going to be you say...we plan on implementing the following lobby hour schedule starting Tuesday, September 5: 12-5pm Tuesday through Saturday and 11am-12:30pm on Sundays.

New Office Copier Access: As you may or may not know we now have a state of the art copier system in the office. We have been doing the Telltale publishing on it for several months now and saving lots of money in fact!. It can scan and e-mail an image with a single push of a button as well as store images of our standard forms to print them on demand. But just like where you may work, we have to keep control of the number of copies and track usage to ensure we can keep a lid on costs and possible abuses. So the copier is set up where you have to provide a charge code to access the copier and the Office Staff will track usage via those codes. Don't worry, if you need to use the copier for AYC business, the charge will be absorbed by the area the work is related to (whether you knew it or not, this has been standard budgeting procedure all along, nothing new here except now we can track it automatically). So if you are needing to make copies for say the B&G Committee, just get the code from the B&G Commander. Of course there is still an strong element of the honor system here so please don't further distribute any codes you may be entrusted with.

This system also will now allow any group at the club to use the copier and take advantage of the low per page costs (and in the case of just scanning and e-mailing, no cost). All that is required is to set up a billable account with the Office Administrator (yes that means you will get a monthly bill!). Currently examples of this are where the Keel Handicap Fleet and the J/24 Fleet already have billable accounts set up with the club so they are already good to go to use the copier for their fleet business as they want. If your fleet or club group wants to also do this and has a billing address, plus the money to pay the bill! :-) just contact our Office Administrator to get an account setup. An account like this can be used for more than charging copier costs; for instance if you want the club to allow members to charge registration fees for a fleet event to their member charge, this is how you can do that also.

But it was "the new guy" Bill Curra, sailing Dos Locos, who passed Festina Lente on the final upwind leg to pick up a second place on the first race of Dog Days 6 and thus cement second place overall in the series. Congratulations!

Final thoughts on the Dog Days: A victory by the Liens adds yet another team to the list of series winners in the Ensign fleet. Each of the three series this year has been won by a different boat. And though

Danny and crew claimed a majority of bullets over the course of the ten race series, four different skippers (Lien, Groll, Baker, Bertin) picked up a first, and four additional skippers (Wilsford, Curra, Romberg, Dahmen) picked up at least one second. Plenty of competition across the fleet.

Even with many of the regulars (Hawk, Groll, Dahmen, Baker, Bené) out for various reasons during much of the series, we still averaged almost 5 boats. It was fantastic to have some new additions to the start line. The Rombergs came out for the second half of the Dog Days series, and we hope they will be back for more in the fall. And, of course, Bill Curra made his debut as a driver in the only boat that didn't miss a race this series. We could hit double digit Ensigns again in the fall series if most of the active sailors make it out regularly, and a bigger fleet usually makes for some great competition from top to bottom. Whether you are a regular, or only an occasional racer (or even if you haven't raced lately), please make an effort to come out this fall. There are six race dates scheduled, though only five opportunities to compete as the Ensign fleet draws RC duty on September 24 (see below). That's it: only 5 more opportunities for series racing in 2007. Don't miss out.

<u>Update on Ramps:</u> At the present lake elevation of 647.88' MSL, the end of the south cove ramp has less than three feet of water over it's end point.

The north cove ramp ends at 639' MSL, which puts a little over eight feet of water it's end. I'm told that there's a short length of pierced steel planking at the end of that. Hopefully we won't find out!




