On the fourth Thursday of every month, except November and December, AYC holds its monthly Board Meeting at 7:30 p.m. in the AYC Clubhouse. (The November meeting is the third Thursday instead of the fourth, to avoid a conflict with Thanksgiving, and there is no meeting in December.) It's at

these meetings, which are open to all members, that the actual business of the Club is carried out. If you haven't been to one lately (or ever) I recommend that you check it out. It's a good window on all the work that goes on behind the scenes to keep the Club running, healthy, and moving forward.

At the January meeting there was a flurry of activity as the Board worked through all the business necessary to kick off a new year at AYC. By the numbers, it looked like this:

20,000: Dollars authorized to hire Loomis Partners, a consulting firm, to conduct the first, planning stage of the Harbor Improvement Project

9,000: Dollars approved to remodel the men's restroom in the Clubhouse and make it wheelchair accessible

1,252: Dollars rolled over on deposit at the Austin Club to reserve their facility for the 2009 Annual Banquet (Continued on Page 5)

### Race Commander Report By Rick Smith

I must admit, the idea of trying to find something to write about every month was a concern when taking this position. The reality is that there are more than enough tidbits of helpful information to fill the entire Telltale. Here is this month's dose of information and comments.

This year's Series Racing got off to an interesting start in that we cancelled the race! I thought it would be good to give some background on the thought that went into that decision. The guidelines in the Race Committee Policy states: "Races may be cancelled for all classes if there is lightening in the vicinity or if the temperature is below 45 degrees." As you can see there is not a lot of guidance or advice in that statement to help make an appropriate decision. There has to be a lot of common sense applied to that rule. The facts of the day were a temperature in the mid 30's, wind at 15kts with gusts, the water temperature of 55 degrees, and overcast. The call we made was to postpone on shore for an hour to allow conditions to change. During that time, we held an impromptu training class on the new rulebook. A big thanks goes out to Steve Gay for jumping in and doing it on the spur of the moment. Those in attendance will agree that nothing changed in that time period. My overriding concern is for the safety of our members. The decision was made to cancel. At that time the social committee stepped in and help salvage the day with a wonderful meal. This is a new addition to the frostbite series and free for members and guest. I spent the rest to the day at the club, and the conditions never improved. We have all second-guessed the Race Committee on this type of call in the past, but please think of the safety of all when this type of action is taken.

Bob Woods placed a copy of the Fort Worth Boat Club Weather Condition Table in my box the same day that we were canceling our first Series Race. The Fort Worth Boat Club uses numerical scores for 4 separate elements: Wind Speed, Ambient Temperature, Water Temperature, and Weather Conditions in order to make the decision of whether to race or to cancel. They tally a combined score of the four categories to make one of three decisions. If the cumulative points are less then a certain number, they sail. If the cumulative points fall within a specified range, they leave the decision up to the Race Committee. If the cumulative points are above a specific number, they cancel all races. This approach is a bit more thoughtful and leaves only a small window of conditions to the Race Committee's discretion. I will be sending this information to the AYC Board, the PRC members, and the Fleet Captains for their review and input. I will also have it posted on the Official PRC Board for all to review. Please feel free to send any

comments you might have on this system or any similar system to improve upon what we have at present. I personally believe this is a much better tool than what we presently have for making this type of decision.

#### Status of implemented changes:

I am happy to say, after one series race, the changes we have implemented seem to have gone over well. The new finish line configuration appears to work as intended. This change will become more important as the level of the lake falls, and we continue to reduce the width of navigable water. The PRC will continue to fine tune the check-in procedures as well as emphasize the importance of the on-the-water data collection for scoring.

#### New changes in works:

We are rewriting the Notice of Race to trim it down to only the pertinent information that changes between series. In conjunction with the Notice of Race, we are reworking the sailing instructions to slim them down by eliminating any instructions that are already listed in the "Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012". If we get this correct, there will be one set of SI's for all series races held at AYC for the year.

Those of you that raced in the second Frostbite series are aware that we took the opportunity, with the cancellation of the first race, to align the Frostbite series with the rest of our series, by re-defining the starting classes

Long Distance Course card will be renamed the "AYC Course Card." It will be a combination of the present Long Distance Course Card on one side and the Round-the-Buoys courses on the other side. A map showing the general location of the main marks used for racing on the lake will also be included. Our intention is to have these laminated and for sale in the office. Of course, there will be paper copies available in the clubhouse.

Please feel free to send me comments on the racing program at the club. The PRC wants to hear your suggestions and ideas on how we can improve racing at our club. Remember the best way to change something is get involved.

# 2009 AYC LONG DISTANCE REGATTA Notice of Race

RULES - The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The 2009-2012 Racing Rules of Sailing.

ADVERTISING - Advertising will be restricted to Category C.

#### **ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

Austin Yacht Club ("AYC") members are cordially invited to participate in AYC's 2009 AYC Long Distance Regatta. The regatta is open to all monohull keelboats, multihull boats (including 'beach cats'), and centerboard boats whose helmsperson or at least one (1) crew member is a current AYC member in good standing.

Eligible boats may enter by submitting a completed registration form together with the required fee at the registration table in the AYC Clubhouse prior to 9:30, February 28, 2009. Early Registration will be available at in person at the AYC office or by FAX.

#### **FEES**

The entry fee includes one (1) T-shirt and two (2) dinner tickets and is as follows:

Single-handed Centerboard Boats

\$25.00

All other participants

\$30.00

T-shirts: A limited number of additional T-shirts are available for \$15.00 each. T-shirts can be purchased during the registration period and after the race.

Dinner: A buffet style pasta dinner with salad and garlic bread will be served after the race.. Additional dinner tickets are available at \$7.50 each and must be purchased at registration to ensure that enough food is prepared.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Participants must provide their own food and drink for consumption during the race. Lunches will not be available from the event sponsor.

#### SCHEDULE

Registration – Saturday, February 28, 2009 from 08:00 to 09:30 in the AYC Clubhouse.

Competitors' Briefing - Saturday, February 28, 2009 at 10:00 in the AYC Clubhouse.

The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 11:30.

- **MEASUREMENTS** No measurement of boats is required. All boats competing in a PHRF handicap fleet must have a valid handicap rating certificate on file with the Keel Fleet PHRF Handicap Committee prior to participating in the Regatta. Members of the PHRF Committee will be available at registration to assign temporary PHRF ratings to boats without valid certificates.
- **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** The sailing instructions (Sl's) will be available on race day at registration and on line at the AYC website ( <a href="http://www.austinyachtclub.net">http://www.austinyachtclub.net</a>) one week prior to the Regatta.
- VENUE AYC is a private yacht club located on Lake Travis, Texas, at 5906 Beacon Drive, Austin, TX 78734-1428. Directions and other information relating to AYC are available on its website located at www.austinyachtclub.net. Please note that neither pets nor fireworks are allowed on club property.
- THE COURSES The Regatta will consist of one (1) long distance race starting in the vicinity of AYC and racing towards Lakeway. Racing will take place on courses defined by LCRA channel markers, AYC permanent buoys, and/or temporary inflatable tetrahedrons at the discretion of the race committee. The turning mark will be adjusted to provide a race of approximately four (4) hours in duration.

#### SCORING

- All boats will be assigned to a Class for scoring purposes. Such Class assignments will be announced at the Competitor's Briefing and will be posted on the official notice board prior to the first race of the Regatta.
- Keel Handicap fleets will be scored using the "Time on Distance" variant of the PHRF handicap rating system utilizing the PHRF of Lake Travis handicap values. Multihull or Centerboard Handicap fleets will be scored using the Portsmouth handicap rating system utilizing US Sailing's 2008 Portsmouth Yardstick.
- One (1) completed race constitutes a Regatta.
- RADIO COMMUNICATION A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats.
- PRIZES Trophies will be awarded to helmspersons and crew in accordance to the overall size of their respective Class as follows:

- Up to 3 participants

1 trophy

- 4-6 participants

2 trophies

- 6+ participants

3 trophies

ries Races, Leukemia Cup, Intergalactics. Skippers may use the larger genoa for PHRF races, beer cans, etc. This rule was enacted with a vision to keep our racing fun and cost effective. Experience suggests that the genoa does little to improve performance except in a whisper of wind. Additionally, one less sail continues to keep our competitive one-design fleet affordable. Use of the smaller sail makes sailing simpler and enjoyable for short-handed crews and family racing. Expect to see the update to the rules on our fleet home web page shortly.

Beyond Our Shores: A warm thanks for Wisconsin based South Coast 21 sailor and new friend of our fleet, Dean Shumway. Dean made a special visit to our club to see the sister ships of his South Coast 21 hull #57, which he acquired 42 years ago. Dennis shared some historic South Coast memorabilia including his original



sale brochure, kit information, invoices, and some wonderful original artwork. This is fun historical material, which you can access on our fleet web page. Dean's vessel was one of the first to come with sliding hatches, instead of the swinging doors. He loved seeing the enhancements several members have made to their vessels and trailers. We are hoping Dean joins us for a few races, especially the Intergalactics.

let pictures speak for themselves. Thanks to **Bob Leonard** for the great photos in this article from Frostbite #2.




Photo Above: Greg Buck trimming the spinnaker aboard Ken Lemons' J105 "Spike", out on the race course for the 1st time.

That's it for now. See you on the water!




