

We've already met several times to work on hammering out the budget, which we plan to present for approval at the January Board meeting. **Steve Eller**, the new Vice Commodore, and **Rick Smith**, the new Race Commander have Version 5 of the racing calendar in the hands of the PRC for final review, and the plan is to have that also finalized by the January Board meeting. In the meantime, Keel Fleet kicked off the racing for the year with one of the all-time great Red Eye Regattas (could the weather have been more perfect in any way?), and AYC series races start on January 24th with the first race of Frostbite Series.

Other Board members have also hit the ground running. Jim Rehage, the new Building and Grounds Commander, has already met with two contractors that I know about, and has a well-defined slate of projects that he wants to tackle this year. Bill Hawk and Christopher Dwight have, among numerous other things, both been working (Continued on Page 5)

Race Commander Report By Rick Smith

Here is hoping your Christmas and New Year was safe and full with family and sharing with others. We, as a community of sailors, give thanks for what we have. I would like to thank last year's board for their stewardship of our club and a heartfelt thank you to **Steve Eller** for his work with the PRC. In the December Telltale we published the first part of the Race Calendar to ensure no confusion with the preliminary schedule. We will post the official schedule on the club web site as soon as the board approves it during the January Board meeting.

On the Race Calendar, we have Race Committee Clinics scheduled for January 18th and February 8th. All AYC members are encouraged to attend. Fleet Captains have been asked to designate a minimum of 2 members from their fleet to attend the Race Clinic.

Published in the December Telltale was an article by **Gail Bernstein** on the new US Sailing Rules changes that go into effect this year. Please familiarize yourself with the new rules to ensure we are all sailing under the same rules (new book cover is Blue and White), <u>The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2009-2012</u>. I encourage everyone to join US Sailing to support our sport and the organization that governs our sailing in the US...plus, you get a free copy of <u>The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2009-2012</u>.

We want to communicate some ideas and changes that we are going to try this year:

•**PRC reps** -The PRC has decided to assign a team of PRC reps to each series to give us more consistent communication over the entire series.

•Starting/Finish Line – For the Frost Bite Series, we will eliminate the poison starting line and will create a very short (poison) finish line on the starboard side of the committee boat. As the lake continues to drop in level, it is important that we keep the large starting line from dictating the tactics while racing. This change should improve the tactical challenge for finishing as well by creating more of a standard finishing line as seen in national regattas. Further details will be in the SI's. Feedback from the Red Eye was positive on this change.

•Mandatory Check-in for Series Races – To know who is racing and in what fleet, we will continue to use mandatory check-in to help the Race Committee accurately start and finish competitors. We will add the following enhancements to the process: First we will have a sign-in sheet at the RC Board to allow the competitors to sign in prior to the race. This sign-in sheet will be removed when the RC heads to the RC boats. We will still have on the water check-in as in the past. You can check-in by passing to the stern of the RC on starboard prior to the first gun. Due to the length of our starting sequences, you may also check-in after your Warning Signal but no later then the Preparatory Down. We are also looking at adding radio check-in using a separate radio channel. Look for more information on this process on the Official RC Board.

•Radio Communications – We are planning on encouraging the Race Committees to use the radio to announce all the information on the race. This will include the starting class, course, starting sequence count down, wind reading, course change discussion, and course changes. This new process is a courtesy to the competitors; visual signals still are the official communication for participants.

•The PRC is also working on the following enhancements:

1. Plan to add a Windlass to the Committee boat.

2. Work with **John Bartlett** and other members to replace the Committee flag system to improve the visibility for competitors, increase ease of use resulting in timelier signals from the race committee. More information will follow as we work out the details.

3. Installation of a second radio as a backup on the RC Boat to help with the continuing issues concerning communications from the RC boat.

4. Work with Sail Training to have quarterly introduction to racing for new members. This may become mandatory for all new members as part of the probationary period.

5. Working with US Sailing to hold a PRO Certification Seminar on March 21st for those who would like to work towards certification. This will be an all day training session which will be open to regional US Sailing Members. We are excited to announce that **Jim Tichenor** will be the lead instructor. Jim is on the Board of Directors of US Sailing and has run many National and Olympic Regattas around the country.

Ensign Fleet News By Randolph Bertin



A New Year!

Not so much to report as we had the month of December off. There are a couple of Ensigns in the fleet sporting some very nice cosmetic improvements (and structural improvements as well), and just about ready for re-

launch: the Bakers' J. Seagull and the Liens' Gravy Boat.

In racing news, four Ensign came out to race the 2009 edition of the Red Eye, which featured fine temperatures and more than enough breeze. Fred Ford and Steve Gay sailed September, but they ended up coming to a dead stop in a confusion of boats at the Committee end of the start line, and though not protested formally, did take a 720 just in case. Unfortunately, that set them back pretty far and they weren't able to get back with the rest of the fleet. Tom Groll was joined by his nephew and Danny Lien and they took an early lead, looking back often enough to see that no one was gaining on them. Tom ended up finishing second overall in our handicap fleet. Frans, George and Karel Dahmen, fitting Esmeralda out with #588 sails, spent a good bit of the race battling it out with Bill Hawk, who made an impromptu start, picking up Randolph Bertin and a couple of sailors who were recent transplants from New England. Bill came out ahead on the first upwind leg, the Dahmens re-gained the lead going downwind, but then lost it in the early stages going back up wind. Both boats ended up hitting the leeward buoy, and performed their penalty turn. The Dahmens managed to stay close to the west shore, and made good ground to windward, coming out on top by the end of the long slog upwind. Back downwind, Bill's crew had some trouble getting the spinnaker set, and though the eventually got it under control, shortly afterwards the spinnaker sheet split apart and that was the end of their spinnaker run. The whole maneuver sent them well back of the Dahmens, and though they made up a fair bit on the final windward leg, it wasn't enough. Frans, George and Karel finished with a third overall in the split.

By the time this newsletter is in hand, the Ensign fleet should have held the Annual Meeting and Social, January 10. Who is going to be the 2009 fleet captain? When will we hold the Region IV Championship Regatta? For these, and other riveting news, be sure to check next month's installment of the leading news source for Ensign Fleet 30.

LCRA wants to hear from YOU!





Keel Fleet, PHRF Information

The AYC Keel Fleet has chosen to utilize the PHRF (Performance Handicap Racing Fleet) handicap system. The PHRF Rating Procedures are administered by the PHRF Handicap committee that is appointed by the Keel Fleet Officers. Fleet members must request a rating for a new boat and resubmit a written rating request if any performance modifications are made to their boat sails or rigging. Until otherwise noted, for 2009 the Keel Fleet class divisions for AYC Series races will be the same as used in 2008 which are:

- A Fleet, PHRF ratings of 0 to 138 Seconds/Nautical Mile,
- •B Fleet, PHRF ratings of 138 and higher and
- •Non Spinnaker Fleet which includes boats with all PHRF ratings.

For races other than AYC series races the Keel Fleet class divisions will be established at each event based upon the boats registered for the event.
